“ALTERED GENES AND TWISTED TRUTH – THE STORY OF GM CROPS IN INDIA”.

A Technical Presentation was held on 22nd August 2017 at the Kozhikode Local Centre of the IE(I). Prof K.P.Prabhakaran Nair, Formerly Professor, National Science Foundation, The Royal Society, Belgium & Senior Fellow, Alexander von Humboldt Foundation, The Federal Republic of Germany delivered an expert lecture on “ALTERED GENES AND TWISTED TRUTH – THE STORY OF GM CROPS IN INDIA”.

Prof (Dr)K P Mohandas, FIE, Chairman IE(I), welcomed the Chief Guest. Er. C.Jithesh, MIE, Hon.Secretary introduced the speaker. Prof K.P.Prabhakaran Nair gave a comprehensive talk about Soil, Green revolution and Genetic Modification (GM) of agricultural crops. In BT Cotton, genes of certain bacterium are transposed with those of cotton and the worms are killed creating an insecticide property for the genetically modified cotton. The latest in the GM family is the GM mustard, where to

control weeds in the field herbicide is recommended, which will kill all the weeds, but not the mustard plant. The most dangerous aspect of this herbicide is that it has as its principal ingredient glufosinate, a neuro-toxin which is carcinogenic. The long term implications on the health of Indians, through GM crops, and its socio-economic impacts, were discussed in the lecture with examples. According to him, the green revolution though improved production, was definitely harmful to our native crops and human beings at large.

Sustainable Water Management: Challenges And Possible Solutions

A Technical Presentation was held on 27th September 2017 at the Kozhikode Local Centre of the IE(I). Prof (Dr) Sudheer KP, Professor, Environmental & Water Resources Engineering, IIT Chennai gave a lecture on Sustainable Water Management: Challenges And Possible Solutions”

Er. C.Jithesh, MIE, Hon.Secretary Kozhikode Centre welcomed the Chief Guest. Prof (Dr)K P Mohandas, FIE, Chairman IE(I), introduced the speaker.

In his speech, he narrated the present scenario of too much water or too little water due to the frequent occurrence of natural hazards, like cyclone, draught, floods due to climate change. He stated that the great challenge for the coming

decades will be the task of increasing food production with less water (water use efficiency), particularly in countries with limited water and land resources. On his case studies, he presented his research teams findings on how to meet the challenges in rural water supply and avoid flood situations. Success in flood water mitigation in Chennai airport and suggestions for Kuttanad back waters were presented.

A seminar on ‘Energy Conservation & Renewable Energy’ was organized jointly by The Institution of Engineers (India), Kollam Local Centre and Quilon Management Association on 29.8.2017. Chief Guest was Dr.R.Harikumar, Director ANERT, Kerala and guest of honour was Prof.P.O.J.Lebba, Former Principal, TKM College of Engineering, Kollam.

Dr.Harikumar gave an overall picture of renewable energy potential. He expressed his displeasure on the slow growth of

solar projects. He explained the various incentives provided by state/central government. To speed up solar projects government relaxed the rules related to inspection and commissioning of renewable generating plants up to 10 kW. New regulation permits utilities to connect such plants to the power grid after inspection and satisfaction by the designated Utility Engineer.

‘Fourth Industrial Revolution: Role of Startups’.

IEI Kollam Local Centre held a joint programme with Quilon Management Association on 30.10.2017. Dr Saji Gopinath CEO, Kerala Start up Mission gave a presentation on the theme ‘Fourth Industrial Revolution: Role of Startups’.

He visualised a new world in the coming fourth industrial revolution. First industrial revolution was in textile and railways, second revolution was in automobiles and the third revolution was linked to computers. We are in the

path of a fourth revolution with different variables. Future management will be based on 'trust' and 'cooperation'. Present path is destructive but the future planning will be based on sustainability. Solar and electric vehicles are part of it. Driverless car will come soon. Large industries will give way to

productions at home, with 3 D printers. He explained various initiatives provided by Kerala Startup Mission to encourage entrepreneurs to take part in the fourth revolution. He explained the Incubation Centre and Fablab under Kerala Startup Mission.
